



## Call for Sessions

### Guidelines for session proposals

Please submit additional session proposals to [nubianstudies2026@lmu.de](mailto:nubianstudies2026@lmu.de).

The deadline is **31<sup>st</sup> July 2025**. No proposals can be accepted after this date.

Proposals must include the following information:

- Title (max. 100 characters)
- Abstract (max. 1500 characters)
- Organisers (list 2 to max. 5 persons and name one main organiser)
- Estimated number of presentations (20mins per presentation)

Please note that you can only be the **main** organiser of a **single** session (but co-organiser of multiple sessions).

### Please also note the following:

Sessions must follow the format of 20min slots for each paper.

All sessions proposals will be reviewed by the organising committee and submission does not guarantee that a session will be accepted. The organising committee also reserves the right to merge proposed sessions when there is considerable overlap.

All paper and poster presentation proposals for accepted sessions will be reviewed by the organising committee in the first instance.

In cases where accepted sessions do not have enough accepted papers, it is possible that sessions will not be able to go ahead or have to be merged.
